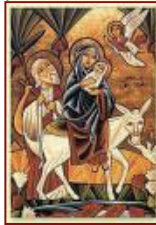

THE E.A.O. 2009 OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

Dr. Faiza Shereen



Faiza Shereen, born Faiza Wahby, was born in Alexandria, Egypt, and emigrated to the United States with her husband, Ahmed Shereen, as a student in 1973. She received a B.A. in English Language and Literature from Alexandria University (Egypt); M.A. in Literature from the University of Dayton (Ohio, U.S.A.); and Ph.D. in Literary Theory from the University of Cincinnati (Ohio, U.S.A.).

Shereen's career as an educator and an academician began in Egypt where she taught briefly at Alexandria University. In the U.S., she has taught in a variety of capacities at the University of Cincinnati in Ohio, the Claremont Colleges in California, and the University of La Verne in California. The span of her professional career, however, from tenure-track Assistant Professor to tenured full Professor, was at the University of Dayton, where she served as a faculty member of the English Department from 1988 to 2005. Currently, Shereen is Chief International Officer at California State Polytechnic University, Pomona, where she

has been since 2005. Her responsibilities span all aspects of international education.

Shereen's teaching and scholarship cover a broad range of related subjects, including: European and British literature of the early twentieth century, literary theory, women in literature, colonial and postcolonial literature, and drama. Throughout her career, she has participated in developing curricula and programs in Women's Studies and International Studies. She has published articles and contributed to collections in all these areas. Her most recent academic publications include "Rhetoric, Reading and Intellectual History," a chapter in *Literary Theory and Criticism*, published by Oxford University Press in 2006, and "Host and Guest in Khatibi's Language," an article on the Moroccan francophone writer Abdelkebir Khatibi, published in *CELAAN, Studies of the Literatures and Arts of North Africa Review*, in 2008.
