EGYPTIAN AMERICAN WINS HIGHEST U.S. SCIENCE HONOR

Mostafa El-Sayed praised for contributions to nanotechnology.

Chemist Mostafa El-Sayed has received the National Medal of Science, the nation's highest science award, for his work on small compounds known as nanomaterials.

He received the award in a September 29 ceremony at the White House.

"I am very fortunate and lucky to be doing science in America. There are so

many excellent people doing science all over this country," said El-Sayed, a professor in the Department of Chemistry and director of the Laser Dynamics Laboratory at the Georgia Institute of Technology in Atlanta. He is also noted for his collaboration with scientists in Egypt.

Born and raised in Egypt, El-Sayed completed his undergraduate training at Ain Shams University in Cairo, Egypt. He came to the United States for graduate school and later joined the faculty of the University of California at Los Angeles in 1961.
